# Course and Program Information



## INTENSIVE PROGRAM (FULL OR PART TIME)

Intensive program students study academic English up to 20 hours per week to rapidly improve their fluency and competency. Core courses focus on reading, writing, listening, speaking, pronunciation, grammar and preparation for the TOEFL iBT examination. The full time program fulfills requirements for an F-1 visa.

<b>Reading &amp; Writing: Mon &amp; Wed</b>	<b>8:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.</b>	\$750	\$1200
Study and practice reading and writing to reach college entry level proficiency. Beginning students start with vocabulary and sentence structure. Advanced students learn to understand college level texts, novels, and other reading materials as well as being taught essay and research writing. Reading and Writing requires two days of study.			
<b>Listening &amp; Speaking: Tues</b>	<b>8:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.</b>	\$375	\$600
Students practice giving speeches, presentations, and conversation to develop fluency, build vocabulary and improve pronunciation in speaking English. Beginning students receive extra help with instruction from Worcester State University graduate level students enrolled in the Communication Sciences & Disorders Department. Advanced students may visit college level classes and lectures with their instructors to increase listening and note taking skills.			
<b>Grammar: Thurs</b>	<b>8:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.</b>	\$375	\$600
Learn and practice the structural relationships of words and sentences to gain confidence in the ability to speak and write english. Students are provided opportunities to practice grammar through all avenues of skill building including reading, writing, speaking and listening.			
<b>TOEFL iBT Preparation: Fri</b>	<b>8:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.</b>		\$600
Intermediate to advanced level students take this course to focus on preparation for the iBT TOEFL examination. Testing strategies are discussed along with targeted practice on test areas that have proven most difficult for students. <i>*TOEFL is available only as a 10 week course</i>			
<b>Integrated Skills: Fri</b>	<b>8:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.</b>	\$375	\$600
Students have the opportunity to reinforce and improve with use of all five of the skills areas in language through an integrated, theme based approach. Students will improve their ability to use English effectively.			

## COMMUNITY PROGRAM (PART TIME ONLY)

Community program classes are designed to improve general English fluency for work and furthering education. Offered in the evening, classes meet twice per week for two or more hours. Upper level students (levels 4 – 6) can choose classes to target their particular areas of weakness. Placement tests are required for all students to determine the best level. These classes help fulfill the requirements of AuPair visas.

<b>Integrated Skills (Levels 1 – 4): Tues &amp; Thurs</b>	<b>6:30 – 8:30 p.m.</b>		\$325
Students develop a broad base in skill areas such as reading, writing, listening, speaking, and grammar. Sentence structure and grammar, along with vocabulary building and writing exercises help students quickly increase their knowledge base and fluency of the English language.			
<b>English through U.S. Culture (Levels 4 – 6): Mon &amp; Wed</b>	<b>6:30 – 8:30 p.m.</b>		\$325
Students have the opportunity to reinforce and improve the use of all five of the skill areas through exploring cultural differences. Students share their varying cultural thoughts and traditions and compare them with contemporary U.S. customs and everyday situations.			
<b>Conversation through Reading (Mixed levels 4 – 6): Mon &amp; Wed</b>	<b>6:30 – 8:30 p.m.</b>		\$325
Students will practice their conversational skills through structured discussion based on assigned readings such as short stories and current events. Learn idioms and other spoken language expression. Requires a placement score of 61 or higher.			
<b>Grammar Trouble Spots (Mixed levels 4 – 6): Tues &amp; Thurs</b>	<b>6:30 – 8:30 p.m.</b>		\$325
Students work on grammar issues tailored to the class needs through requests and instructional diagnosis. Requires a placement score of 61 or higher.
